in this book goriunova offers a critical analysis of the processes that produce digital culture digital cultures thrive on creativity developing new forces of organization to overcome repetition and reach brilliance in order to understand the processes that produce culture

the author introduces the concept of the art platform a specific configuration of creative passions codes events individuals and works that are propelled by cultural currents and maintained through digitally native means art platforms can occur in numerous contexts bringing about genuinely new cultural production that given enough force come together to sustain an open mechanism while negotiating social technical and political modes of power software art digital forms of literature 8 bit music 3d art forms pro surfers and networks of geeks are test beds for enquiry into what brings and holds art platforms together goriunova provides a new means of understanding the development of cultural forms on the internet placing the phenomenon of participatory and social networks in a conceptual and historical perspective and offering powerful tools for researching cultural phenomena overlooked by other approaches

this volume provides an innovative and timely approach to a fast growing yet still under studied field in latin american cultural production digital online culture it focuses on the transformations or continuations that cultural products and practices such as hypermedia fictions net art and online performance art as well as blogs films databases and other genre defying web based projects perform with respect to latin american ist discourses as well as their often contestatory positioning with respect to western hegemonic discourses as they circulate online the intellectual rationale for the volume is located at the crossroads of two equally important theoretical strands theories of digital culture in their majority the product of the anglophone academy and contemporary debates on latin american identity and culture

cultural production in virtual and imagined worlds foregrounds how the two important fields of visual culture and internet culture interact this collection of essays explores the intersections overlaps and disparities in terms of how the two discourses illuminate our everyday negotiations as we become increasingly dependent on the internet and virtual visual imaginings for constructing who we are what is being examined here are the ways in which we use visual virtual lenses to see the world both individually and collectively this book represents a transnational effort that began as a series of conversations during the mid atlantic popular american culture conferences from 2005 2009 the editors a canadian and an american have included contributors across national and geographic contexts cultural production is aimed at raising questions crossing borders and presenting points of departure for future scholarship in the relatively new and very rapidly changing disciplines of visual and virtual cultures our critical approach to this study includes viewing internet images as contested sites of cultural activity and also as sites that advance ideologies related to cultural transformation

cultural production of hallyu in the digital platform era explores how histories industry structures and politics interact in the platformization of the korean wave dal yong jin argues

that while much research centers on the korean culture takeover and the dominance of korean products on premier global media platforms korean cultural industries also experience reshaping and changing depending on the platforms often on the global stage addressing the increasing significance of digital platforms this work examines the transformative roles of over the top streaming services netflix viki and v live video sharing platforms such as youtube and social media platforms such as tiktok and instagram and the power relations between content producers information technology sectors the government creative laborers and audiences in the globalization of korean culture and media by developing critical cultural industries studies as a new theoretical framework cultural production of hallyu in the digital platform era explores the ever growing korean wave phenomenon with the advent of global digital platforms

to improve their understanding and interventions beyond superficial best practice snippets and simplified success stories

social media have dramatically popularized practices of evaluation especially of cultural products and artistic expressions the practices of liking and rating any shared contents such as music to blogs film videos photographs to artwork and performances are ubiquitous in today s digital environments as a result creative producers are increasingly developing reputations and careers through a complex blend of online social reputation management and distribution platforms and more longstanding forms of marketing channels and professional evaluation in this context online evaluation of creativity and the arts seeks to examine the newly emerging forms of evaluation such as contests competitions ranking commenting liking and rating which are taking place in digital environments in doing so this book investigates the criteria and assessment practices tied to the evaluation of creativity and artistic works and further questions what is at stake when digital environments heighten the role of amateur and peer criticism to the level of expert critiques while exploring potential informal learning opportunities and offering incisive critiques on the emerging norms and standards of evaluation the essays in this book cover a wide range of artistic and creative practices

this book explores how creativity is increasingly designed marketed and produced with digital products and services a process referred to as softwarization if being creative has developed into one of the paradigmatic architectures of power for framing the contemporary subject then an essential component of this architecture involves its material and symbolic configuration through tools from image editors to digital audio workstations video editors to game engines these modern tools are used by creatives every day and mastering these increasingly complex technologies is now a near compulsory pathway to creative work despite their ubiquity in cultural production few have sought to theorize them in aggregate and with interdisciplinary breadth by bringing disparate creative and methodological traditions in one volume this book provides a comprehensive overview of approaches for understanding this complex emerging and dynamic field that speaks beyond the disciplinary categories of tool instrument and or software it makes a unique intervention in the fields of cultural production and the cultural and creative industries

traveling texts and the work of afro japanese cultural production analyzes the complex conversations taking place in texts of all sorts traveling between africans african diasporas and japanese across disciplinary geographic racial ethnic linguistic and cultural borders be it focused on the make up of the blackface ganguro or the haiku of richard wright rastafari communities in japan or the black enka singer jero the volume turns its attention away from

questions of representation to ones concerning the generative aspects of transcultural production the contributors are interested primarily in texts in motion the contradictory motion within texts the traveling of texts and the action that such kinetic energy inspires in readers viewers listeners and travelers as our texts travel and travail the originary nodal points that anchor them to set significations loosen and are transformed the essays trace how in the process of traveling the bodies and subjectivities of those working to reimagine the text s in new sites moderate accommodate and transfigure both the texts and themselves

this book addresses the conceptual lapse in the literature regarding the relationship between cultural production and participatory politics by examining their connections in a range of national and political contexts each chapter examines how youth engage cultural production as part of their political participation and how political participation is sometimes central to and expressed through cultural production the contributing authors provide examples of the intersections between youth cultural production and participatory politics and bring together a range of approaches to the examination of these intersections providing illustrations of the complexities involved in these processes each of the chapters takes up different kinds of practices from street art to video production from online activism to installation work they also examine a range of political contexts from students striking at the university of puerto rico to activism in community arts centres and university classrooms the book considers what becomes evident when close attention is paid to the intersection of cultural production and participatory politics what does participatory politics help people to see about cultural production and how does cultural production expand how people understand participatory politics this book was originally published as a special issue of curriculum inquiry

poets writing in spanish by the end of the twentieth century had to contend with globalization as a backdrop for their literary production they could embrace it ignore it or potentially re imagine the role of the poet altogether this book examines some of the efforts of spanish language poets to cope with the globalizing cultural economy of the late twentieth century this study looks at the similarities and differences in both text and context of poets some major and some minor writing in chile mexico the mexican american community and spain these poets write in a variety of styles from highly experimental approaches to poetry to more traditional methods of writing included in this study are chileans raúl zurita and cecilia vicuña spaniards leopoldo maría panero and luis garcía montero mexicans silvia tomasa rivera and guillermo gómez peña and mexican american juan felipe herrera some of them embrace and are even embraced by media both old and new whereas others eschew it some continue their work in the vein of national traditions while others become difficult to situate within any one single national tradition exploring the varieties of strategies these writers employ this book makes it clear that spanish language poets have not been exempt

from the process of globalization individually these poets have been studied to varying degrees globalization has been studied extensively from a variety of disciplinary approaches particularly in the context of the latin american region and spain however it is a relative rarity to see poets being studied as they are in this work in terms of their relationship to globalization taken as a sample or snapshot of writing tendencies in latin american and spanish poetry of the late twentieth century this book studies them as part of a greater circuit of cultural production by establishing their literary as well as extra literary genealogies and connections it situates these poets in terms of their writing itself as well as in terms of their literary traditions their methods of contending with neoliberal economic models and global information flows from the television and internet although many literary critics attempt to study the connections and relationships between poetry and the world beyond the page few monographs go about it the way this one does it takes a transatlantic approach to contemporary spanish language poetry focusing on poets on poets from spain and the american continent emphasizing their connections commonalities and differences across increasingly porous borders in the age of information the relationship between text and context is explored with a cultural studies approach more often associated with media studies than with literary studies literature is not treated as a privileged object of isolated study but rather as a system of ideas and images that is deeply interwoven with other forms of human expression that have arisen in the last decades of the twentieth century the result is a suggestive analysis of the figure of the poet in the broader globalized marketplace of cultural goods and ideas contemporary hispanic poets cultural production in the global digital age is an important book for library collections in spanish latin american and iberian studies chicano studies
